10 Things to Check Before You Set Sail

Don't let trouble sink your good time. Keep it safe, relaxing, and fun for everyone and avoid danger with proper precautions. According to Parachute, Canada has lost 10,511 boaters between 1991-2010. You can avoid becoming a statistic by observing some simple watercraft safety tips and suggestions.



SAFETY: Fire and water never mix, so be sure to install appropriately rated fire extinguishers—and check them regularly.



TOOLS: Don't get caught with your tool belt down—pack tools, spare parts, rope, and other supplies before you set sail.



FLOATATION: The Red Cross states drowning makes up 95% of recreational boating fatalities. Make sure to always have correctly sized life preservers for every person onboard.



EMERGENCY
BEACON: No better
time to be noticed
than now. Flares,
GPS & emergency
beacons help
rescuers find you in
an emergency.



FUEL: Don't run out of gas before you run out of water. Always carry more fuel than you think you're going to need.





PROPULSION: If your sail, outboard, or stern drive fails; a set of oars or a trolling motor can help you get back to shore.



COMMUNICATION:
Roger that! A
two-way radio with
weather alert helps
you remain informed
and stay in touch
with those on shore
and others on the
water.



SUPPLIES: Hope for the best; prepare for the worst. Always carry a bailer, emergency food, and drinking water in case you are lost, get stranded, or take on water.



Get smart or get hurt. Licensed, certified boaters are safer boaters—so get some training and keep all your certifications current.



FIRST AID:
Accidents & injuries
can happen at any
time so make sure
you have a fully
equipped first aid kit.



ALCOHOL & DRUGS: Leave these ashore. When on the water, keep your reflexes, reaction time, and judgement sharp.



EXCESSIVE
SPEED: Just like on
the road, speeding
will get you in
trouble—and can
cause an accident.

wake alone.
